Following the Junior Awards, the Awards for the 2009 Orienteer of the Year, 2009 NSW Handicap, 2009 MTBO Super Series, 2009 MetrO League, 2008-09 Sydney Summer Series, 2009 Sydney Orienteering Series and a number of special

awards were presented to the worthy recipients. A full listing of the various scores is in the results section of this newsletter and on the various websites.

Encouragement Award (Cox's Cup)

Awarded to an orienteer who makes efforts to encourage other orienteers by both personal efforts and example. This year's winner, Geoff Todkill NC, has had (and continues to have) a large involvement in beginner coaching with his club and also is involved as a NSW selector.

Rookie of the Year

Awarded to a new (less than 2 seasons) orienteer showing a high level of competitive achievement. This year's winner was Kerrie Mitchell WP who, in her 1st year of State level competition, won W Open B in the Orienteer of the Year competition and in her first red courses at WMOC finished 17th in W45A sprint and 2nd in W45B long.

NSW Interclub Trophy

Awarded to the club with the highest club score in the OY events. The winner was Newcastle Orienteering Club.

Graham Mitchell Award

This is awarded to the Course Setter of the Year based on results of the website survey. The winner in 2009 was Karen Blatchford NC for her courses at QBIII Day 1 (State league #6) at Cessnock.

The winner was Newcastle Orienteering Club, for their continued efforts with the organization of a very full local program and local promotion of the sport, a membership increase of 10% and high representation at major events.

From the President. . .

As the year rapidly draws to a close and the weekly Summer Series well under way, I would like to thank the many NSW Orienteers involved in the organisation and running of World Masters Orienteering Championships (WMOC) held in mid-October.

On behalf of OANSW I would like to congratulate Nick Dent and his organising committee and the team leaders for their efforts in delivering an outstanding series of events. WMOC2009 was the largest event ever undertaken by OANSW, and all involved should be proud of their achievements in making the event a great success.

The success of WMOC was publicly recognised at the OANSW annual awards which took place last month at the North Ryde RSL with Nick Dent being awarded the President's Award for 2009 for his outstanding dedication and organisation of WMOC. Of course without his equally dedicated team of volunteers, some of whom were involved since early 2008, the event would not have been the great success that it was, and the Association also thanks them all for their hard work.

While there is only one President's Award awarded each year, I felt that this year one other orienteer should also be recognised for their significant involvement in WMOC. Newcastle's Rob Vincent was recognised for his role as National Controller for the WMOC events. It was Rob's responsibility to ensure that the technical aspects of the competitions conformed to IOF rules and WMOC guidelines. In fact not only did Rob act as the National Controller, managing each of the day controllers, but he was also involved in the mapping of the bush areas. As a result Rob was recognised for his significant contribution to WMOC2009 (and also for JWOC2007, and even the Australian Championships Carnival in 2004, where he had the same role!).

The Annual Awards evening also recognised many other worthy recipients of the various awards available in 2009, with a complete listing being provided elsewhere in this edition of the newsletter. Congratulations to all the winners.

More recently an Association meeting was held at Sports House where the following items were discussed:

- Web-based Results Publication (paper)
- WMOC Maps (paper)
- Schools and Community Development Presentation
- Marketing and Promotion in NSW (paper)
- Calendar 2010 (paper)

For more information on the above and other items discussed at the meeting I encourage you to talk to your club delegate at your next club meeting. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the delegates that attended for their involvement in the evening's discussions.

The Meeting was notable not only for the fact that it did not finish until well after 10:30pm but also because with the use of Broadband and Skype, Alex Davey (Communications Director) (in Wagga) and Felicity Brown (Promotions Director) (in Canberra) were able to join the meeting. With the use of this technology it should also be possible for regional clubs to also join future Association meetings.

With WMOC having concluded, signifying the end of a long 2009 bush orienteering season - it's time once again for everyone to change from their studs to their runners and to change their mindset to street and sprint techniques with the Sydney Summer Series already well under way. Early in the New Year will see an expanded Sydney Sprint Series commence, with a series of ten races being arranged and coordinated by Terry Bluett to look forward to. While a little closer to home this year is the annual Xmas 5 day, which this year will be "just down the road" in the Southern Highlands with the 5 events being coordinated by Dick Ogilvie.

Whatever you do for this year's holidays - take care and a merry Xmas to all.

ACT v NSW Challenge, 2009

For only the 2nd time in the last 10 years, ACT was successful in winning the Bennelong Trophy for our annual competition based on the results of the NSW and ACT Championships. Because we now conduct different classes (ACT has 10-year age groups) the points scored are "normalized" to a total of 50 points awarded at each

Championship. ACT won the ACT Championships by 27.9 to 21.1 and NSW Championships by 26.5 to 23.5 - the total was in favour of ACT by 54.4 to 45.6.

This concluded a very good year for ACT as they also won the two interstate competitions on the AUS Champs - see article in the next column.



Australian Championships

The Australian Championships were held near Castlemaine, Bendigo, Benalla and Wangaratta in late September/early October. All Australian Championships were conducted in the 9-day long Carnival including the Middle Championships on 26 September, the Schools Championships on 29/30 September, the Sprint Championships on 2 October, the Long Championships on 3 October and the Relay Championships on 3 October.

NSW orienteers performed well during the Carnival with 22 first placings. Note that as only Australians are eligible to be called Australian Champions, all New Zealand competitors (and those from other countries) have been ignored in tabulating the statistics below. Full results can be found on the Orienteering Australia website www.orienteering.asn.au

In the Australian Long Championships there were 6 firsts, 8 seconds and 12 thirds. This resulted in NSW (40 points) finishing 3rd in the OA Shield for the state point score behind ACT (57) and VIC (45). This is in fact the first time that NSW has not finished at worst 2nd. First placegetters were: Bjorn Mella NC M45A, Ian Hassall IK M75A, Jenny Enderby NC W40A, Maureen Ogilvie UR W75A, David McKenna UR M45AS, Carolyn Rigby NC W55AS.

The NSW Stingers were 4th in the Silva Trophy for the M21E teams event and 4th in the Ambassadors Trophy for the W21E teams event.

In the Australian Relay Championships, NSW managed to pick up 3 firsts, 3 seconds and 4 thirds and this gave us 2nd (19 points) in the Xanthorrhoea Trophy for the interstate points competition just behind ACT (23 points). Teams that placed first for NSW were: M35A (Damian Welbourne NC, Tony Hill GO, Paul Marsh BF), M45A (Russell Blatchford NC, Alex Davey WR, Bjorn Mella NC), W65A (Janet Morris WH, Sue Thompson GO, Maureen Ogilvie UR)

There were also 6 firsts, 7 seconds and 3 thirds in the Australian Sprint Championships and 6 firsts, 6 seconds and 4 thirds in the Australian Middle Championships. First placegetters were:

In the Australian Schools Championships Michele Dawson GO was 2nd in Junior Girls individual and NSW relay teams were 1st in Junior Boys (Angus Roberts NC, Lewis Berkholz NC, Matthew Hill GO) and 2nd in Junior Girls (Michele Dawson GO, Anita Merrotsy NT, Nicola Blatchford NC). NSW was 4th in the point score behind QLD but could easily have challenged but for the lack of a Senior Girls team (there were only 2 NSW competitors) and the unfortunate mispunch in the Senior Boys relay which we would have won.

Level 1 Coaching Course Postponed

The L1 Coaching Course mentioned in the last newsletter, proposed for November 2009, has been postponed to a date yet to be determined in 2010. With many NSW Orienteers involved with the World Masters the original timing was not ideal! The Board is seeking some experienced Coaches to organise and run the course so if you are in that category expect a call over the summer months. Once we have suitable people available we will set a date and publicise the event widely.

Sydney Sprint Series



Commencing for 2010 at Georges Heights Oval on Monday 4 January, The Sydney Sprint Series has grown out of the Summer Monday Park series of events originally organised by The NSW Stingers. This, the fifth series, has been expanded to 10 events. The format is an orienteering sprint. The events will be in spectacular harbourside areas such as Georges Heights and Watsons Bay.

You will enjoy the challenging courses on new 1:4000 or 1:5000 sprint maps of Watsons Bay, Callan Park and Macquarie Uni and fully updated maps of Manly Dam, Bicentennial Park, West Pymble plus many old favourites.

The courses are suitable for beginner and experienced Orienteer alike. The exciting courses will showcase some of Sydney's best parks, bushland and cityscape terrains. They are set to short sprint distances of 2.5 - 3.0km. The average runner is expected to complete the course in around 35 minutes.

Starting times to suit you and your family or work mates are available at the venues between 5:00 and 6:30 pm. The entry fees are \$10 seniors, \$8 juniors. The entry fee includes a coloured orienteering map of the sprint area.

SportIdent electronic timing will be used at the start and finish (and possibly for other check points also). You will need an e-stick for the timing system. If you don't have one they are available for hire for \$2.
