JWOC 2007 Area now available in Catching Features

Earlier this year OANSW was approached by young Finnish orienteer Jukka-Pekka Seppänen requesting if he could convert one of the JWOC 2007 areas for use on Catching Features. Without ever having visited Australia Jukka has managed to transform the JWOC Long Distance area at Sappa Bulga for use on Catching Features and given it a "look and feel" of the typical Australian gully-spur terrain familiar to Australian orienteers.

For those NSW orienteers who are not familiar with "CF", it is a computer-based game that you can play on a PC. Several different modes of play are available. Individual courses are run with interval starts against computer opponents, or with a mass start against lots of them. For more information on Catching Features visit www.catchingfeatures.com

RouteGadget

In addition to the NSW newsletter being made available via the OANSW website, some of you may have noticed a link on the home page to RouteGadget: http://garingal.com.au/cgi-bin/gadget3/reitti.cgi

This web-based utility, currently housed on the Garingal Orienteers server, allows orienteers to draw and compare their routes. Used in conjunction with split times from SportIdent it is possible to watch a race to see where it was won and lost. Those orienteers with GPS tracking devices (Garmin Forerunner for example) can download their route directly into RouteGadget, while orienteers without a GPS tracking device can still draw their route on by hand.

Mapping Matters Club-level

The Orienteering Australia Mapping Committee met at Easter in Tasmania. A number of matters were discussed at the Meeting that are of possible interest to many NSW orienteers. Further information can be obtained from the OA Mapping Committee Chair, Adrian Uppill (aruppill@chariot.net.au).

Digital Printing

The use of digitally printed maps for Group A events (AUS Championships, AUS 3-Days, NOL Events) needs to be approved by the OA Mapping Committee Chair. As part of this approval process a Print Tech 'test sheet' should be provided to the Mapping Chair when requesting approval. This sheet provides an excellent basis on which to assess the suitability of the printer and paper used. An electronic version of the sheet is available from the Association office.

CMYK Colour Settings

marking colour setting for Purple is 30/100/15/00 but subject to a print test on the course map. This setting appears to be more acceptable to a wider range of people. The default setting for OCAD of 100% Magenta should not be used. For other colours the recommendation is to use the OA "OCAD Colour table" as the starting point for digital

printing, then fine tune to the individual printer.

MTBO Track Classification

The 2 x 4 track classification as developed in Australia has been accepted by the IOF MTBO Discipline Committee but not the IOF Map Commission. The 2 x 4 therefore remains non compliant, although for uniformity within Australia it should be used as the standard track classification. OCAD copies of the ISMTBOM 2007 incorporating the "standard 2 x 4" track classification are available from Andrew Slattery or Adrian Uppill

Sprint Maps

A number of minor matters have been identified in relation to sprint maps. These are as follows:

1 It is suggested that non-standard symbols be avoided where an existing symbol will suffice (e.g. using the fence symbol for horse jumps).

2 There is need in some cases to highlight a passageway by using course planning symbols crossing point (708) or crossing section (708.1)

3 The use of a bounding line improves legibility for olive green (forbidden areas/gardens), particularly for small areas. 4 Note that sprint maps only have two fence symbols passable (522) and impassable (524). The broken fence symbol does not apply to sprint maps




