The Orienteering Association of NSW (OANSW) is seeking a part-time Administration Officer to provide support to the sport of orienteering in NSW. If you are reliable, self-directed, and somebody who likes completing tasks efficiently, and you have good computer skills (Microsoft Office, Access, website CMS), and are willing to work flexible hours for approximately 3 days per week, then this may be the job for you.

The primary focus of this role is to administer and manage the processes associated with operation of a sporting association. This will include, but not be limited to, operation of the Association database, book-keeping and payments, preparation of reports for clubs, the Board, OA and relevant Government departments, and publication of the newsletter and content on the website. You will be working with a range of volunteers throughout the sport.

Familiarity with orienteering is desirable. Previous experience with administrative support to a sporting club or organisation would be extremely beneficial. We require an enthusiastic, reliable and wellpresented person who will have a confident telephone manner and good interpersonal skills. You must be keen and willing to learn, have good written communication skills and a driver's licence.

You will be located at our Homebush office, and will have contact with people primarily by email and telephone. You will be responsible for seeing that all reports and other publications are produced on time. You will report to the OANSW Executive, who are all volunteers.

We will train you in all relevant procedures, but we do expect that you will be a confident computer user, and be competent with Microsoft Office programs. Ideally, you would have a minimum keyboard speed of 40wpm.

MTBO in **Portugal**

MTBO WOC 2010 in Portugal was a great experience, and hugely different from mv previous 3 WOCs. First there was the Portuguese terrain, which was relentlessly hilly, rocky and rough, with a mosaic of working pine forests, farms and scrubby commons. As it turned out, Jenolan East was a prescient choice of selection trial - well done to Mountain Devils and Bigfoot for making the map and event happen! The sprint race in the historic centre of with cobblestones, Chaves, stairs, traffic marshals with whistles and a start/finish in a dusty stadium was a whole new world of MTBO, too. Then there was the climate, which hit us with successive 40 degree days during the training camp, apparently related to a desert wind blowing up from Morocco. Fortunately, the longer races were held at higher altitude and race week started with a cool change, so we didn't have to find out what 2 hour races in 40 degrees would have been like.

The next thing to get used to were peculiar local "obstacles", like wandering COWS. unrestrained dogs and "tracks" that turned into boulder fields or ponds when dots appeared on the map. On training maps, some tracks had turned into blackberry patches, or seemed never to have existed. The unfenced donkeys were much friendlier than the loose dogs, which were pretty keen on chasing bicycles. The small villages where we congregated for training exercises were like another world - grandma and grandpa pushing wheelbarrows up the tiny, cobbled streets and curious locals stepping out of their cornfields and cafes to have a friendly laugh at us with all our lycra and shiny bikes.

The ubiquitous cafes made the best coffee I've had in Europe, an unexpected pleasure after 2 weeks of disappointing coffee while riding in France. Oh, and an absolute steal at 50 Euro cents a cup! The food was also consistently good - eating out in a restaurant the first week and self-catering the second was a



great option. Fortunately, lots of Portuguese food seems to be free of gluten, dairy and egg, so the team never had to use its Epipen lessons to rescue Mel from anaphylaxis.

Having survived the climate, the terrain and the food, we still had to face the actual competition. The numbers of both senior men and women competing are pretty static, which means still no "real" qualifying for the long final for the women. However, there are gradually more countries competing, and the standards in the middle ranks seem to have picked up significantly. It's a lot harder to finish in the top 20 now than 5 years ago... Many of the top contenders are the same ones as years ago, although whole new teams of podium placers, like the Danes, have emerged. The average age seemed younger to me, although that might just be because I'm (gasp) older??

It was lucky for me that Alex Randall was in the team, or I'd be left as the oldest member.

Having the 3 junior boys in the team kept us all feeling young and silly, though. They made a huge contribution to its being the happiest WOC team I've ever been on. Even our mandated (by coach) maximum half hour sulks after a bad ride were adhered to. As much as the juniors contributed to the cohesion and spirit of the team, it was also a great opportunity for them to be around the experienced and accomplished seniors, especially AJ and Alex. AJ was always willing, in his quiet and thoughtful way, to share his wisdom about every aspect of MTBO from route choice to the fastest way to turn your bike around at a control. It was just a shame we couldn't find a junior girl to even trial, let alone make the team - there were only 24 junior girls competing, and we 2 senior girls could then have made up a relay team. As it was, we rode as hard as we could in the Australia 2 men's team, but

even the slower men's teams are incredibly strong compared to us.

The team was ably supported by coach, Kay Haarsma, and team helper, Briohny Lebbink. They made sure we had the training we needed, food, clean clothes and hugs. Thanks to them, the whole thing ran smoothly, allowing us to concentrate on our racing and recovery. Doing an MTBO WOC is an expensive exercise, and any financial help is greatly appreciated – as such, big thanks from Melanie Simpson and me must go to OANSW for their generous support. In addition, I would like to acknowledge Mountain Devils, David West and Mark Shingler for organising events in the lead up and setting training courses for me. State League Handicaps a Family Affair.

With ten State League events now completed, the handicap point score is being led on four of the twelve courses by members of the Blatchford family. Josh Blatchford is leading RED2, Russell RED5, Karen RED6 and Nicola leads RED8. Similarly Aiden and Graeme Dawson are leading ORANGE and RED4 respectively.

The handicap competition is being run on all NSW State League events with each course treated as a separate class. Each orienteer is assigned an individual handicap for the course they are running based on their results from the previous three events thev contested. Competitors who have not completed three events in the last two years compete with a scratch handicap. At the end of each event the handicaps are used to calculate the

adjusted times and points are awarded. For those courses with a large number of competitors, first place is awarded 25 points, second place 24, third 23 and so on. Courses with smaller numbers are awarded 15 points for first, 14 for second, etc. Competitors who start but do not complete their course or miss punch are awarded 1 point. The final yearly point score is based on a competitors best eleven results from the thirteen events.
