- 1. School Coaching
 - 1) Orienteering NSW appointed Development Officers or club members with current level O or above coaching accreditation may provide introductory coaching services within schools.
 - 2) Development Officer coaching activities will be conducted on a cost-recovery basis.
 - Club coaching should be conducted on a voluntary basis however reimbursement of out of pocket costs may be negotiated with the school in advance.
 - 4) NSW Department of Education orienteering guidelines should be observed.
- 2. Level O accreditation
 - 1) Coaches with current Level 1 accreditation or beyond may conduct Level O training courses for teachers.
 - 2) Minimum requirements for these courses must be cleared by the Coaching Director in advance.
- 3. School related programs
 - 1) Appropriately qualified coaches may also conduct sessions in programs such as the Australian Sport Commission's Active After-schools Communities program.
 - 2) All coaching through the Australian Sport Commission's Active After-schools Communities program should be coordinated through the Association office and coaching and mapping fees agreed with the school in advance.
- 4. School mapping
 - 1) Mapping may be conducted by Association appointed mappers on a cost recovery basis.
 - 2) Mapping may be conducted by clubs on a voluntary basis.
 - 3) IOF sprint standards should be applied to all school mapping unless otherwise agreed with the school and Technical Director.
 - 4) Electronic copies of all school maps should be forwarded to the Administration Officer.
- 5. <u>School or NSW Department of Education events</u>
 - 1) Development Officer event management activities will be conducted on a cost-recovery basis.
 - 2) Where volunteers are needed to assist with event management, they may be reimbursed for out of pocket expenses.
 - 3) NSW Department of Education guidelines should be observed.
- 6. Child Protection
 - 1) All NSW regulations with regard to child protection should be observed at all times when coaching or conducting events for children.
