We started the year with a New Years 5 Days in Goulburn. The first State League events were on ACT maps at Rendezvous Creek and Glendale to help test the Sportident equipment. SH and IK did a splendid job setting courses on maps a long way from their area.

We then traveled to Orange, Toronto, Lithgow and again to Goulburn before sojourning north to compete in the Australian Championships and APOC Carnival in Warwick. This also included the Australia New Zealand Challenge and it was a pleasure to see so many New South Wales competitors make the Australian teams.

The rest of the year seemed a little of an anticlimax unless you enjoyed yourself at the events at Mittagong, Oallen, Wagga and finishing in the challenging 2-Day NSW Championships at Cowra.

The MetrO League was again a successful series of events. Congratulations to all the winning teams. The Summer Series continues to grow with attendance from orienteers and also summer runners. Let's aim to get some of these to join OANSW in 2001.

It was a pleasure to accept both the OFA Shield for the individual point score and the Xanthorrhoea Trophy for the Relays on behalf of NSW at the carnival in Queensland. NSW also won the Bennelong Trophy for the NSW/ACT Challenge run over the two State Championships.

The Annual Presentation Dinner was again enjoyed by those who attended.. Awards were presented for OY, MetrO League, Junior Awards as well as the major Interclub and personal Trophies.

For the seventh year in a row I must congratulate the NSW Schools team which again won the Australian Schools Championships in Queensland.

COACHING

Coaching Courses

A Level 1 course was conducted this year, over a two day period, with six participants. There were a further two Level 0 courses run by Graham Galbraith (the Part Time Development Officer) which attracted 13 participants.

Junior Squad

The State Junior Squad maintained its high level of activity throughout the year with 4 weekend camps being held. Due to the changes in the orienteering calendar, brought about by the Olympic Games, the annual week long camp was not run. An average of 18 of the 24 squad members attended the camps. Thanks are extended to Glen Meyer and Michael Davis for their input as my Assistant Coaches in 2000.

Accreditation and Re-accreditation

As of December 2000, we have 29 coaches accredited with the Australian Coaching Council; 25 at Level 1, 2 at Level 2 and 1 at Level 3. This forthcoming year of 2001 will be a major year as far as re-accreditation is concerned, as 20 of the total 29 listed coaches are due for re-accreditation.

Womens Weekend

The disrupted O calendar did not permit the conduct of the usual annual women's training weekend in 2000. We have been successful in obtaining a government grant up to \$3,750 based on a one for one dollar of expenditure for women's coaching in this coming year of 2001. Consequently the activities of weekend of 7 and 8 April 2001 will be heavily subsidised. Peta Whitford the eminent female Level 3 orienteering coach in this country, will be the main presenter at the weekend. Clubs should encourage their female members, irrespective of their level of skill, to attend.

DEVELOPMENT

The Part Time Development Officer, Graham Galbraith was kept very busy during the year addressing requests from schools and community groups who wished to experience orienteering. On a measure of the number of groups serviced, 2000 can be regarded as the most successful year yet for the PTDO position and Graham can be congratulated for his worthy efforts. Lyn Malgrom has taken over the PTDO role for 2001; at least initially on a temporary basis.

Without denigrating the essential and valuable work performed by Graham Galbraith and previous PTDOs, I see a need to introduce an additional yardstick to measure success in this department; namely that individuals and/or schools, groups, etc are converted to membership of the OANSW. This issue will be discussed with the permanent PTDO when appointed.

The ongoing Operational Plan continued to be evaluated and updated during 2000. One glaring omission in our 2001 Event Programme is the lack of regular MTBO events. This is now being rectified with a view to holding at least five minor MTBOs in NSW prior to the National and NSW Championships in the Southern Highlands in November. To assist with the planning of MTBOs and to ensure a full programme of events is scheduled on the OANSW calendar in 2001 and future years, a MTB Interest Group (MTBIG) will be formed early in 2001.

NEWSLETTER

A total of five OANSW Newsletters were distributed during 1999 to all NSW members. These coincided with the quarterly distribution of The Australian Orienteer plus an extra January newsletter to provide information on early events in the orienteering calendar. Dave Lotty coordinates the results section whilst I, in the main, am responsible for articles and reports.

The format of the newsletter was largely unchanged from previous years, and included inserts on coming events, pre-enter sheets and results. The January newsletter also included the event calendar 'blue card'.

The newsletters contained a range of useful articles and reports including:

- technical hints and advice;

- OANSW administrative matters including notification of meetings, vacancies on Board, membership information, etc.

- progressive reports on MetrO League and other events;

- contributions and thoughts from readers on local and overseas events and experiences;

 acknowledgment of the sport's major sponsors and information on how to take advantage of offers for orienteers.

The Results Sheets reported on all results from major and minor events throughout the year, with the exception of major events where separate results were sent out. Set deadlines for submission of preevent information to Dave Lotty ensured that Coming Events information and pre-entry forms were distributed well in advance of events.

PROMOTION

2000 has been a year of consolidation for many programs.

- Of the 12 who attended last year's O-cad workshop most have now set courses and either

edited existing maps or made maps. These volunteers

are an asset to their clubs and hence orienteering. - The OANSW website is now up and

running thanks to Jon McComb. The site links to many other sites of interest to Orienteers.

- State League results and pointscores, are published promptly by Ken Sinclair and can be found on the OANSW site.

- Summer Series results and pointscores are published by Graham Hill and Ivan Kent ensures they are quickly on the OANSW site.

- A promotional orienteering bumpersticker was sent to all memberships and many have been used to put the word Orienteering into the public's view.

- Graham Galbraith, as Part Time Development Officer ran a number of high quality promotional programs in the Sydney area.

The best promoting of orienteering comes from the public's exposure to a variety of well run events.

- Most clubs ran Come And Try It events. These events are essential to attract newcomers to the sport.

- The Summer Series has gone from strength to strength, attracting both 'old' and 'potential' orienteers; a great promotional opportunity.

- MetrO League competition is well supported by club teams and has increased numbers of EOD runners; another promotional opportunity at a competitive event handy to the local community.

- The State League events provide opportunities for clubs to use local press as well as providing a venue for the promotion of our elite orienteers.

- MTBO is a growing aspect of orienteering and promotes the sport to a whole new participation base.

With our eyes to the future, we need to consider a number of aspects of orienteering

- The position of Part Time Development Officer needs to be maintained. This position, more than any other, takes orienteering to the public. The load could be shared by a number of orienteers with a

variety of skills.

- With event venues and results available to all on the web, it will become more difficult to convince runners to become members of clubs. This is a concern of all states, and already some are watching their memberships fall. The Summer Series has more new runners than any other event and organisers are making a concerted effort to attract those runners to join a club.

- Volunteers largely run orienteering. It is our responsibility to appreciate the contributions of those volunteers by assisting them in the gaining of skills and constantly taking into consideration their workload.

- OANSW Promotional materials are always available and should be visible at all events. Every club should have a promotions officer to take the strain off setters and organisers.

- Lastly, we must remember that most orienteers join a club because they know someone who orienteers. Sell your sport to your friends and acquaintances.

Our strength is in our commitment to our healthy and challenging sport and our willingness to encourage others to join us.
