The 2022 Australian Schools Orienteering Championships were a great success for the NSW Team. They once again came away with the overall Teams Trophy for the second consecutive Carnival.

NSW has taken out the 2022 Australian Schools Orienteering Championships winning the champion state in regional Victoria. With the championships cancelled in 2020 and 2021 due to Covid it was great to have the team competing again.

The competitions were held in regional Victoria. The Sprint Distance at Sacred Heart College, Kyneton, Long Distance at Mount Alexander, Harcourt and the relays at Chewton.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE NSW SCHOOLS TEAM

- Alvin Craig, Cooper Horley, Sam Woolford, Erika Enderby, Ezster Kocsik, Nea Shingler, Lilja Lehtonen and Savanna Sweeney were named in the 2022 Australian Schools Honours Team. It was amazing to have eight NSW athletes out of the twenty named in the team.
- Sam Woolford, Erika Enderby and Nea Shingler represented Australia at the 2022 Junior World Orienteering Championships in Portugal.
- **Nea Shingler** represented Australia at the 2022 World Orienteering Championships in Denmark.
- Nea Shingler, Erika Enderby and Sam Woolford all podiumed at the 2022 National Orienteering League in the Junior Elite which is 20 and under. Nea at 17 was 1st, Erika at only 15 was 2nd and Sam at 17 was 3rd.

AUSTRALIAN SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIPS 2022

2022 saw NSW send a team of 19 to the **Australian Schools Championships in Victoria.** The only state to have representatives from the Australian team that competed at the Junior World Orienteering Championships. This shows the depth of junior orienteering in NSW.

NSW won the Champion State. Results were NSW 71, ACT 61, Tasmania 52, Victoria 47, SA 42, Queensland 41, WA 13.

Part of the championships also included two teams from New Zealand. The New Zealand teams competed against each state of Australia in the Southern Cross Junior Challenge. NSW was 3rd in the challenge. Southern Cross Junior Challenge Results - NZ Haruna 96, NZ Karahiwi 93, NSW 83, ACT 62, Tasmania 52, Victoria 49, SA 42, Queensland 41, WA 13

The Australian Schools Relays were the final school's competition. NSW again dominated winning the Senior Girls (Erika, Mikayla, Nea), Senior Boys (Oskar, Sam, Alvin), with the Junior Girls finishing 2nd (Rebecca, Maggie, Lilja) and the Junior boys 5th (Alton, Rory, Alex).

In the Teams Points competition NSW won the Senior Girls, Senior Boys and Junior Girls. A great achievement for NSW. This is a combination of the results from the sprint, individual and relay.
