The OY Series (now known as State League Events) took us to a variety of areas starting in Orange, progressing to Armidale, Bungonia, Lidsdale, Wallerawang, Newcastle, Penrose, Canyonleigh and ending at the NSW Championships at Wagga Wagga. We also had two combined events with Canberra.

The Metro League was again a successful series of events. Congratulations to all the winning teams. Hopefully the Division 5 will continue to attract new members to participate as part of a club team rather than just as an individual.

The NSW Long Championships were again held in the metropolitan area. Both the Night Championships and the NSW State Relays were held at Lansdowne.

The Summer Series continues to grow with attendance from orienteers and also Summer runners.

The year was highlighted by the successful Australian Championships in the Goulburn area organised by Uringa and the Relays by Garingal. Congratulations to both clubs as the events were enjoyed by many Interstate as well as NSW Orienteers and it was a pleasure to accept both the OFA Shield for the individual point score and the Xanthorrhoea Trophy for the Relays on behalf of NSW.

The Annual Presentation Dinner was again enjoyed by those who attended. Awards were presented for OY, Metro League, Junior Awards as well as the major Interclub and personal Trophies.

For the sixth year in a row I must congratulate the NSW Schools team which again won the Australian Schools Championships. The Championships were organised by Western Hills Club.

May Orienteering in the year 2000 be as successful as that in 1999.

COACHING

Coaching Courses

Attendance this year was low, attributed to a number of factors. Those who attended lacked nothing in enthusiasm. A change of venue and format is being considered for 2000.

DEVELOPMENT

The success of The Part Time Development Officer has been a feature of the 1999 Year. The initial work by Michael Davis has been enhanced more recently by Graham Galbraith, to ensure that the sport of orienteering is presented to user groups and a diverse range of prospective orienteers.

At Board Level much work has been undertaken in continually evaluating the Operational Plan (formerly known as the Development Plan). This work has ensured that OANSW is able to react positively to meet the changing demands of the technical and recreational needs of orienteers.

Courses for OCAD and a number of Training weekends have been run during 1999. These courses have enabled orienteers to hone their skills which leads to improved performance be it organisational or on a competitive front.

NEWSLETTER

A total of five OANSW Newsletters were distributed during 1999 to all NSW members. These coincided with the quarterly distribution of The Australian Orienteer plus an extra January newsletter to provide information on early events in the orienteering calendar. Carol Osborne was editor for several of the newsletters but was overseas for the last part of the year and Dave Lotty and Neil Prosser edited in her absence.

The format of the newsletter was largely unchanged from previous years, and included inserts on coming events, pre-enter sheets and results. The January newsletter also included the event calendar 'blue card'.

The newsletters contained a range of useful articles and reports including:

- technical hints and advice;
- OANSW administrative matters including notification of meetings, vacancies on Board, membership information etc.
- progressive reports on MetrO League and other events;
- significant contributions and thoughts from readers on local and overseas events and experiences;
- acknowledgment of the sport's major sponsors and information on how to take advantage of offers for orienteers.

The Results Sheets reported on all results from major and minor events throughout the year, with the exception of major events where separate results were sent out. Set deadlines for submission of pre-event information to Dave Lotty ensured that Coming Events information and pre-entry forms were distributed well in advance of events.

- Many ideas were received on how to increase the profile of Schools Champs.
- Names of journals and shops which would display promotional materials for O events were gratefully received.

The best promoting of orienteering comes from the public's exposure to a variety of well run events

- Many clubs ran Come And Try It events. These events are essential to attract newcomers to the sport.
- The Daylight Savings Series has gone from strength to strength, attracting both 'old' and potential orienteers; a great promotional opportunity.
- The MetrO League competition is well supported by club teams and has increasing numbers of new EOD runners; another promotional opportunity at a competitive event handy to the local community.

In August Graham Galbraith was appointed as Part Time Development Officer and attended the National Promotion Conference with Lyn Malmgron. He has already started a number of promotional programs in the Sydney area.

The Association thanks all members who promote orienteering by making use of brochures and by encouraging first-timers. Our strength is in our commitment to our healthy and challenging sport, and our willingness to let others join us.

TECHNICAL

1. Quality of Events

No problems were experienced which resulted in the cancellation of courses at Major Events this year.

2. Event Controlling.

The National Controller Accreditation Scheme was maintained in NSW.

No Controllers Courses were conducted during 1999.

Technical information was disseminated to Controllers and also to clubs and Association Members through Association Bulletins.

3. Other Issues.

An Introductory Course for users of OCAD was conducted by Mike Anderson, in particular covering the drawing up of courses for printing. Subsequent to the course it was agreed that a local OCAD User Group should be set up.

The Association agreed to the proposal that when two State League events are conducted on a weekend, course lengths on the second day should not be reduced. It was also agreed that to reduce the numbers competing on the Red 7 course, an extra course be introduced at State League events.

OANSW Event Regulations were reviewed to ensure agreement and compliance with the new OFA Competition Rules.
