The State League Events took us to a variety of areas including Lithgow, Armidale, Goulburn, Mittagong, Cowra/Orange, Newcastle, Belanglo and finishing with the NSW Championships at Molong. We also had a combined event with Canberra in April.

The MetrO League was again a successful series of six rather than seven events. I must admit I missed having a semi-final. Congratulations to all the winning teams. Hopefully the Division 5 will continue to attract new members to participate as part of a club team rather than just as an individual.

The Summer Series continues to grow with attendance from orienteers and also summer runners. It's good to see some of these runners starting to join clubs and compete in other events.

This year also saw an increase in attendance at mountain bike orienteering and the successful NSW and Australian MTBO Championships at Penrose and

Wingello. They even got me to ride on a borrowed bike!

To me the year was highlighted by the successful Womens Training weekend in Lithgow. Women of all standards from newcomers to previous summer runners to green, orange and red level orienteers got together under the expert guidance of John Porter and visiting coach Peta Whitford from Victoria. Most of us also enjoyed a break from home where we were driven up in a bus, stayed at a Motel, ate lots of food and spent the days in the outdoors. We also had a reunion weekend in November to discuss how the training had helped us and brush up on a few points.

Those who attended again enjoyed the Annual Presentation Dinner held at the new venue in Chipping Norton. Awards were presented for State League, MetrO League, Junior Awards as well as the major Interclub and personal Trophies.

Although the NSW Schools team did not win the Australian Schools Championships it was a pleasure to see the team trying their best and they were a credit to New South Wales. I'm starting to get used to seeing this group of youngsters suddenly appear out of the bush with blue hair. Orienteering in a team isn't just about winning but representing your state and being part of a joint effort.

May Orienteering in the year 2002 be as successful as that in 2001.

COACHING

Women's Coaching: During the year two Women's Training Weekends were held, one in May the other in November. The May event was highly successful and with the aid of a government grant for "women in sport" we were able to conscript the Victorian level 3 coach, Peta Whitford, to conduct the course. Some 28 people attending the weekend voted it technically and socially A plus. A much smaller number returned to Belanglo in November for an enjoyable follow-up activity.

Coaching Accreditation: 12 level 1 coaches were re-accredited in 2001, whilst the total number of accredited at year end stood at 25 level 1 and 1 level 2. Currently 7 people are working on the practical aspect of their level 1 accreditation requirements. The usual, annual, level 1 course was not held during the year with the next being scheduled for early in 2002. 2 level 0 courses were conducted by the professional and part-time development officers.

Association Training Weekend: The Association Training Weekend was poorly supported and a mere 6 people attended. Nick Wilmott conducted some activities for those who did go. Another attempt to have a successful weekend is scheduled for April, 27th & 28th 2002.

DEVELOPMENT

The Board position responsible for Development was vacant for part of the year. Mike Weller filled it in June. The position is responsible for monitoring the Association's Management and Development Plan, also known as the Operational Plan.

An Operational Plan 2001-2003, based on a similar OA document, was in place during 2001. This report references that plan.

Given prevailing circumstances, and considering the relevance of the items in the plan, satisfactory overall progress was achieved. The following items are worthy of note.

1. Review of the OANSW organisational structure was not attempted. This has been programmed for 2003.
2. An application for Active Australia Provider status was lodged, but the detailed report has not yet been completed. This has been re-scheduled for 2002.
3. The Operational Plan was reviewed, and a new, more up-to-date plan was prepared. This will be adopted from 2002.
4. Liaison with NPWS and Forestry, while ongoing, was low-key. It will receive greater emphasis in 2002.
5. Long term plans for international events were not formally considered, but will receive closer attention in 2002.
6. Formation of a senior squad was initiated on an informal basis. Formal action was deferred till 2002.
7. Opportunities for participation in NSWIS did not present themselves.
8. An OA standard database was not developed. Hence, no action was required on this in NSW.
9. Strategies to attract women, juniors, and masters were not formally discussed. This will be pursued from 2002, as part of a broader promotional strategy formulation.
10. A level 1 coaching course was not conducted. This will be programmed for 2002.
11. A school O-page on the Association's website was discussed, but not implemented. Sufficient need was not identified.
12. Electronic newsletters were considered, but not adopted at this stage. The current hard-copy newsletter was deemed adequate.

PROMOTION

Most of last year's promotional activities involved getting mountain bike orienteering (MTBO) launched in NSW.

Early in the year, it was decided that a special MTBO club should be formed to attract non-foot-O orienteers to the sport - Mountain Devils MTBO. Publicity was generated in a number of cycling magazines as well as a few local Southern Highland newspapers.

At its first of six events, which was held at Belanglo, 94 entries were received made up of foot-Oers and cyclists. The major event of the year was the successful Australian/NSW Championship Carnival held at Penrose/Wingello for which 150+ entries were received, although not all in both Championships. The Carnival set new standards for MTBO in Australia in terms of organisation, prizes, and number of entries. In all, Mountain Devils organised six events; one in conjunction with Newcastle Orienteers.

Mountain Devils were able to secure a sponsorship arrangement with a cycle shop, Renegade Cycles, who donated almost a thousand dollars for banners and event signage. In addition, club members receive a \$50 voucher upon joining to spend at Renegade and receive on-going discounts on all cycling equipment and clothing.

The OANSW Board approved a social membership category, which allows members of foot-O clubs to join Mountain Devils and thus receive the benefits of the Renegade Cycles sponsorship. Mountain Devils now has a total of 32 memberships of which 12 are Social. In all, there are 41 riding "members" in the club. Not bad for a club which didn't exist a year ago.

An unintended consequence of the Mountain Devils phenomenon is that junior orienteers are now pestering their parents to buy them a mountain bike!

SCHOOLS

The Juniors have trained hard and performed strongly this year. They were third in the Australian Schools Orienteering Championships after two very strong teams from Victoria and Tasmania. Congratulations to David Meyer, Julian Dent and Steve Todkill for their selection in the Australian Schools Honour Team. Thanks also go to Nick Dent and Hillary Wood for their capable management of the team, and to the parents who supported the juniors in their fundraising.

Support for the Junior Awards (Waratah, Banksia and Wattle) continues to increase with over 50 awards made at the Annual Presentation Dinner.

The Part Time Development Officer has worked with a number of schools in Sydney West. These groups included a Secondary Gifted and Talented Class and a Geography class. Sydney West held their inaugural Schools Gala Day with over 300 primary children attending. There are now four school regions holding their own Gala Days with support from local clubs. For many, these events are a lead-up to the NSW Schools Orienteering Championships.

In 2002 the NSW Schools Championships are to be held in conjunction with a State League event to display a more competitive environment for first-time

competitors.

A submission was made to Orienteering Australia on the proposed Orienteering Australia Controller Accreditation Scheme and the workshop held by OA was attended. Following the workshop, the NSW Controller's List was updated in accordance the proposed OA accreditation levels.

Two Controllers Courses were conducted during the year, one in Sydney and one in Armidale. Two NSW Controllers were accredited as IOF Event advisors (previously IOF Controller).
