The State League Events took us to a variety of areas including Wagga Wagga, Lithgow, Goulburn on a few occasions including the Australian 3 Days, Orange for QB3 and back again for the Xmas 5 Days and finishing with the NSW Championships at Tarago.

The MetrO League was again a successful series of six rather than seven events. Congratulations to all the winning teams. Hopefully the Division 5 will continue to attract new members to participate as part of a club team rather than just as an individual.

The Summer Series continues to grow with attendance from orienteers and also summer runners. It's good to see some of these runners starting to join clubs and compete in other events.

This year also saw an increase in attendance at mountain bike orienteering. They had a series of events as well as the successful NSW Championships at Sunny Corner near Lithgow. Well worth the effort of borrowing my son's bike to have a go.

The Annual Presentation Dinner was held at a new venue in Turrumurra. Awards were presented for State League, MetrO > League, Junior Awards as well as the major Interclub and personal Trophies. A few orienteers enjoyed dancing the night away as well as coming in a variety of dress from formal to outback.

The NSW Schools team was again successful at the Australian Schools Championships

May Orienteering in the year 2003 be as successful as that in 2002 and may the new President enjoy the role as much as I have and see as many exciting changes to the sport but above all may the membership continue to increase.

TREASURER

I don't normally submit a report as I figure the numbers usually "speak for themselves". However this year is a bit different so I will jot a few notes.

First please let me assure everyone that both the President and Treasurer stepping down at the same time in no way reflects the finances of the Association, they're fine!! Judy has been in her position for 5 years and believes it is right to roll people over after a period. I have held my portfolio for 6 years and leave for the reason that I am simply so tired of driving up and down the F3.

I am also content that now is a reasonable time to leave while the association's finances are stable and I have achieved most of the things that I set out to do. Whilst in any one year there may be a cash surplus or deficit, if you bracket together a couple of years then they usually balance out creating a stable environment.

In rough chronological order the changes whilst I have been treasurer include:

- The elimination of keeping separate accounts for Belanglo, juniors, etc. All funds are now pooled and dished out according to the annual budget. Eliminating accounts allowed the association's incomes and expenditures to be summarised on a single page thus making for easy reading.
- Collating each year's result onto a spreadsheet has made for easy budgeting of upcoming years. An effort was made to ensure that a separate term deposit was set up to provide for the PO's Long Service Leave. This account is monitored and topped up annually to keep the account close to the provision required.
- All incomes and expenditures are now channelled through the books for transparency.
- A couple of years ago GST was introduced fairly seamlessly thanks to Dave's understanding and increased attention.
- Sportident was purchased, note however that the funds were donated in one year then spent in the next thus introducing variation to the budget for each

year. Sportident hire equipment was bought back from the consortium earlier than planned in order to channel the earnings to the association.

- Laptops were purchased to complete the range of Sportident equipment

- The high cost of digitally printing short map runs is of concern to me. Efforts have been initiated to bring this activity into the Association office in order to (1) lower the drain of funds from the Association and (2) introduce increased flexibility.

On a cash flow basis, most of the association's earnings occur in the second half of the year, likewise the government grant doesn't appear until December. The association has sufficient funds in the working account to cover this skewed cash flow and to ensure that activities can continue for about 12 months should there be any problem with the government funding. As I said, things are nicely set up at the moment that should make it fairly easy for a new treasurer to step into the role.

COACHING

Coaching Accreditation: 4 new level 1 coaches were accredited in 2002, whilst the total number of accredited at year end stood at 26 level 1 and 1 level 2. Currently 3 people are working on the practical aspect of their level 1 accreditation requirements. The usual, annual, level 1 course was not held during the year with the next being scheduled for 2003. The Professional Officer and part-time Development Officer conducted several level 0 courses in 2003.

Association Training Weekend: The Association Training Weekend had a disappointing level of support with about 20 people in attendance. The weekend has not been programmed in 2003.

Squads: The Junior Squad continues to operate successfully and is enthusiastically supported by the squad members. In late 2002 a Senior Squad was formed with the assistance of Linda Sesta.

DEVELOPMENT

The Association's Operational Plan is divided into 2 parts: Specific Projects and Procedural Activities 2002 Highlights are shown below.

Specific Activities/Projects

- Newton & Weller attended a directors' course – as a direct result, we conducted a Risk Management assessment (not previously planned)
- An outline paper on strategic objectives was prepared – this underlies our broad management approach.
- We have continued liaison with State Forests, but the response is slow
- We have initiated a JWOC application for NSW (2007)
- A NSW Senior Squad was formed
- A Major Events Organiser's Guide was prepared
- An outline promotional strategy was prepared (but promotion needs a lot more work)
- Media coverage of events received minimal attention from the Association

Procedural Activities

- Only 2 Association meetings were held; none in regional centres

- National League needs to be promoted – a newsletter article perhaps?
- Add task "Maintain Senior Squad" for 2003 and beyond
- Search for new areas - could be supplemented by re-use of old areas
- Attendance at OA committees – has NSW been sufficiently active?
- Schools Information Booklet – do we maintain this?
- Junior Diary system – general awareness needs to be increased
- An e-bulletin was added to NSW publications
- Low, if any, Ski-O activity
- MTBO growing strongly – considerable effort by Lynn Dabbs & Frank Assenza

PROMOTION

2002 has been a year of major development for Orienteering.

- . Mountain Bike orienteering has been the success story of the year. MD is the fastest growing club and presents a very competitive series of events in the annual calendar.

- . Many of the clubs who sent representatives to the CORPSE course run by Ted Mulherin are now running on maps generated by that software. These volunteers are an asset to their clubs and hence orienteering.

- . The OANSW e-Bulletin is now up and running thanks to Neville Fathers. This service compliments the OANSW web site and gives orienteers up-to-date information every week. It is also a link with email newsletters from other states.

- . Summer Series entries are increasing rapidly and there has been some flow-over into club membership and bush running.

- . Sportident was used by most clubs to run events and the expertise generated by that use is a credit to Ron Pallas and the clubs themselves.

- . The Winter series has consolidated its position in the Orienteering Calendar thanks to the efforts of Ian Miller. The best promoting of orienteering comes from the public's exposure to a variety of well run events.

- . Most clubs ran Come And Try It events. These events are essential to attract newcomers to the sport.

- . The MetrO League competition is well supported by club teams and has increased numbers of EOD

runners; another promotional opportunity at a competitive event handy to the local community.

. The State League events provide opportunities for clubs to use local press as well as providing a venue for the promotion of our elite orienteers.

With our eyes to the future, we need to consider a number of aspects of orienteering

. The position of Part Time Development Officer needs to be maintained. This position, more than any other, takes orienteering to the public. The load should be shared by a number of orienteers with a variety of skills.

. With event venues and results available to all on the web, it will become more difficult to convince runners to become members of clubs. This is a concern of all states, and already some are watching their memberships fall. The Summer Series has more new runners than any other event and organisers are making a concerted effort to attract those runners to join a club.

. Volunteers largely run orienteering. It is our responsibility to appreciate the contributions of those volunteers by assisting them in the gaining of skills and constantly taking into consideration their workload.

. OANSW Promotional materials are always available and should be visible at all events. Every club should have a promotions officer to take the strain off setters and organisers.

. Lastly, we must remember that most Orienteers join a club because they know someone who orienteers. Sell your sport to your friends and acquaintances. Our strength is in our commitment to our healthy and challenging sport, and our willingness to encourage others to join us.

SCHOOLS

Congratulations to the Schools Team on their nail biting win at the National Schools Championships at Wilpena SA. Thanks go to Nick Dent and Hillary Wood for their capable management of the team. Their experience will be invaluable to whoever takes their place in 2003. Thanks also to the parents who supported the juniors in their fundraising and by getting them to events and training.

Support for the Junior Awards (Waratah, Banksia and Wattle) continues to increase with over 50 awards made at the Annual Presentation Dinner.

The Part Time Development Officer has worked with a number of schools in Sydney West. These groups included a Secondary Gifted and Talented Class and a Geography class.

Sydney West and Sydney South West both held a Schools Gala Day with over 300 primary children attending. There are now four school regions holding their own Gala Days with support from local clubs.

For many, these events are a lead-up to the NSW Schools Orienteering Championships. In 2003 the NSW Schools Championships were held in conjunction with a State League event to display a more competitive environment for first-time competitors. This seems to have been successful with an increase in the numbers of junior competitors, and a good promotional opportunity for older

orienteers to see the novice juniors who participate at a school level.

Thank you to Dave Lotty and John Porter for their continued support in training the Junior Squad and to the parents of all juniors for their efforts in getting young orienteers to events.

TECHNICAL

1. Standard of Events

Twelve Major events were held in 2002, comprising the NSW Championships and 11 other NSW State League Events. The events were all of a high standard and no courses had to be cancelled due to organisational problems.

2. Controller Accreditation.

Currently there are 61 accredited controllers, 51 men and 10 women, of whom 3 are IOF Event Consultants, 8 are Level 3, 19 Level 2, and 31 Level 1.

3. OFA Technical Committee.

The OANSW was represented at Technical Committee meeting held at Goulburn during the Australian 3 Days at Easter.

4. OANSW Technical Manual

Various revisions were made to the OANSW Manual to reflect changes at a National level and to ensure that the manual meets the needs and demands of NSW orienteers. Updating of the Manual will continue on an ongoing basis and the current version will be maintained on the Association Web Site.

5. Technical Courses.

5.1 No Controllers courses were conducted in 2002. Future courses will be conducted using the syllabus developed by OA and approved by the Australian Sports Commission for the NOAS Level 1 Officiating Course (Controller Accreditation).

5.2 A Sportident Users course was conducted by Ron Pallas.

5.3 An Introduction to CORPSE course planning software was conducted by Ted Mulherin.
