#### COACHING

I organised a Level 1 Coaching Accreditation course at the end of March this year at Belanglo State Forest organised with help from John Porter, Barbara Junghans and Chris Baker. To complete the course, a Friday evening of talks and activities was held. Thanks go to Jan Sargood and Jock Davis for their help that evening. Nine orienteers from six clubs participated. Four of these have successfully completed the follow up work to gain their accreditation: Chris Baker, Ron Junghans, Rob Chapman and Adrian White. In addition, Robbie Preston who had completed the weekend course a year ago completed his follow up work and gained accreditation. There are now 27 accredited coaches within NSW - all at Level 1. In the next year we are hoping that at least some of these will be working towards their Level 2 accreditation.

The Senior Squad's training has been organised within the group, mainly under the direction of Eric Morris. At present, the Association is working with the Stingers to put together more formal arrangements concerning the way that activities and training are undertaken.

The Junior Squad has had a successful year under the leadership of John Porter and Dave Lotty, with help from others. Five camps were held during the year, with up to 19 juniors participating. Thanks to all those people who helped to make these camps so successful. Our future elites will be rising from these ranks.

#### PLANNING

As usual, the Board dealt with a host of administrative matters. Operationally, the emphasis was on major events, with the conduct of the Aus Champs Carnival, and the commencement of planning for JWOC. Following are highlights of 2004 activities.

- 2004 saw the Board return to a full complement of 9 directors with the Communications portfolio being filled by Ken Sinclair (WHN). A casual vacancy occurred mid-year, when Stuart McWilliam (Finance) stood down due to work commitments. The Finance position was filled by Robert Spry (BNN).
- Board members continue, in turn, to attend Dept of Sport & Recreation directors' courses to maintain Board competence. Lyn Malmgron and Paul Prudhoe attended courses.
- Forests NSW has developed a Sustainable Recreation Policy that guides user access, and has a draft access policy for Orienteering. On behalf of the Association, Mike Weller has

entered into discussions with Forests about a formal agreement, which will hopefully guarantee access and standardise fees for orienteers.

- The Australian Championships Carnival was successfully conducted. This provided better than expected income, and should prevent a general fee increase in 2006.
- A JWOC committee was established early in 2004, and Carnival planning has commenced. Several key issues have emerged, namely the event management structure, initial funding (loans are being sought from clubs), and the post carnival map distribution.
- Sydney was awarded the 2009 World Masters Games. As a result, OANSW will be hosting WMOC, probably in the greater Lithgow area.
- The XMAS 5-Days was held in the Armidale area
- Only one significant promotional activity was conducted – a 'Come-and-try-it' style mini event was held at the Forests NSW Family Fun Fair, organised by Malmgron and Lotty, with most helpers from Garingal.
- The NSW Junior squad received greater exposure with the purchase of new banners (sponsored by the Carbine Club).
- Moves are afoot to increase funding to the Stingers (NSW NOL team), to encourage better performance and participation in competitions against other States. This may include scholarships to AIS in Canberra.
- Ron Junghans conducted a Level 1 coaching course at Belanglo in March.
- The annual Association prize-giving was poorly attended
- Two Association meetings were held; none in regional centres.
- Pallas, Lotty, and Weller attended the OA National Conference in December.
- The Board continued its ongoing detailed review of operations as part of a risk management strategy.
- The NSW e-bulletin continues with success (Neville Fathers).
- MTBO continues strongly.

#### PROMOTION

2004 was another full year for orienteering in NSW, with the sport's premier event, the Australian Championships, being conducted in NSW. It is the running of events such as the Australian Championships Carnival, and the associated positive impact that our sport has on the various local communities by way of accommodation, café, restaurant and retail outlet usage, and liaison with local landowners that best promotes our sport. Without the support of the local communities, Orienteering in some of the magnificent areas that we have access to would not be possible.

Last year it was announced that NSW had been awarded the Junior World Orienteering Championships (JWOC) in 2007. To ensure the event is a success a committee of interested and committed volunteers has been formed. The first major target is the submission of a grant application to the NSW Dept. of Sport and Recreation at the end of March 2005. The hosting of JWOC2007 should be seen as a golden opportunity for the sport to promote itself, especially in light of the Premier's views that the sport is of benefit to the health of the school aged community.

The Summer Saturdays conceived and organised by Lyn Malmgron, and aimed at families and the promotion of Orienteering in the Western Suburbs of Sydney commenced in 2004. The success of the events in attracting new orienteers has yet to be gauged, but the events are nevertheless giving seasoned Orienteers an opportunity to run during the off- season.

The Sydney Community College 'Introduction to Orienteering' courses also commenced in 2004 as a part of the adult education environment. This is an ideal way to introduce navigation and map reading. The Association conducted a number of courses.

The best form of promotion of orienteering continues to come from the public's exposure to a variety of well-run events, with minimal impact on the areas used. Most clubs continue to run Come and Try It or local "low-key" events. These events are essential to attract newcomers to the sport. Informal surveys show that most newcomers find out about these events through their local club, people they know or by use of the local press. As a continued part of the promotion of the sport the Association mapped the Cumberland State Forest (near Castle Hill) and attracted more than 50 newcomers to an event held in October. The event was held in conjunction with State Forests' Family Forest Fair. Blue and Green courses were on offer to a mainly junior entry.

Television promotion was not as widespread as 2003, however thanks to the efforts of Garingal's Tim Cox, the Australian Championships Carnival did receive excellent local media coverage in the Central West of the State.

The Sydney Summer Series goes from strength to strength, under Ross Barr's direction. Ross and all of the clubs involved are to be congratulated. It is one thing to spend a weekend setting up an event to cope with around 200 entrants – it is something completely different to cope with almost 200 entrants over a period of 2 hours and with entries fees taken at the event. The Summer Series continues to attract

novice orienteers and offers them the opportunity to develop map-reading skills on the run. With the continued success of the Series is it time to split it in to a Northern and Southern Sydney Series, or perhaps an Eastern and Western Series?

The Summer Series and Winter Series continue to attract both experienced and novice orienteers, but how do we convert the newcomers to bush orienteering? Should the Association be concerned if the conversion rate to the more conventional form of bush Orienteering is low? Or should we be satisfied that Summer Series numbers are being maintained?

Newcastle Orienteering Club continued with their own version of mid-week street orienteering events and 2004 also saw the OANSW 2004 Club of the Year, Central Coast Orienteers, initiate a Summer Series of its own for runners in their area.

The MetrO League competition continues to be well supported by club teams, and apart from the few relay events held each year the MetrO League is really the only opportunity for clubs to compete together as teams; again, this is another promotional opportunity to the local community. 2005 will see the adoption of a National Orienteering Day in May. It is planned that this be an annual occasion with each State conducting an event to promote the sport.

The State League events provide opportunities for clubs to use local press as well as providing a venue for the promotion of our elite Orienteers and the sport in general.

Mountain Bike Orienteering took a giant leap forward with both the successful 2004 World MTBO events in Victoria, and with the excellent results achieved by the Australians competing in the events.

Orienteering in NSW continues to show an increase in active participants and it was good to see the large number of junior orienteers participating in the 2004 Waratah Awards. We must ensure that we continue to encourage and nurture our juniors for the sake of the future of the sport in NSW.

One final noteworthy mention of an event that promotes the sport is the annual Xmas 5 day competition. Originally organised on the Central Coast and offering the opportunity for a run in the bush, followed by more leisurely activities in the sea and sand, the venue has since moved on to be organised in different areas around the country. The events, and the current coordinator, OANSW's Technical Director Dick Ogilive, are to be congratulated. The event has for many years attracted orienteers from around the country and from overseas, and last year's event held in the New England region of NSW was no exception.

As with most annual reports, while they are designed to be a reflection on the past, they should also look to the future. This being the case, the following areas of the sport in NSW will require support and consideration from the Association's membership next year and beyond.

- 1. As reported above, the organisation for JWOC 2007 is already underway. This event will require the support from the clubs of NSW and individuals. The running of JWOC 2007 will give the Association future access to quality terrain for the next few years after JWOC has been concluded.
- 2. As a result of NSW being awarded the 2009 World Masters Games, OANSW will (almost certainly) be invited by the IOF to conduct the World Masters Orienteering Championships in conjunction. This will be a further opportunity to promote the

collective skills of the NSW orienteering community both nationally and internationally.

- 4. OANSW and OA promotional materials remain available to each club and should be visible at all events, especially Come & Try It's and Street-based events. If the sport is to continue to grow it is essential that every club has a promotions officer to assist setters, organisers and other club officials.
- Orienteers are the best ambassadors and promoters of the sport. For the sport to grow each member of the Association should take it upon themself to try and introduce at least one new member every year.
- 6. To reach the wider public, clubs should look to promote themselves and the sport in whatever ways are possible. It is recommended that clubs look to their local newspaper for advertising and promotion opportunities. It is the cheapest and easiest form of publicity and reaches a large audience with the minimum amount of effort.

#### **SPECIAL PROJECTS**

#### Schools/Juniors

2004 was a fantastic year for orienteering in schools. Over 900 children took part in Regional school competitions and many teachers were introduced to competitive orienteering through these events. Our aim in the future should be to encourage these competitors to participate in the NSW Schools Championships.

Thanks go to Sandra Stewart, Diane Van Netten and Lyn Malmgron for their capable management of the NSW Schools Team. They spent a huge amount of time organising fund raising, new tracksuits and T-shirts as well as looking after the wellbeing of the team at competitions. The team worked hard to raise funds to add to their sponsorship funds from The Carbine Club. Unfortunately they were out-classed on the day but Matt Parton, Joshua Roberts and Emily Prudhoe gave very strong performances. Joshua and Emily were chosen in the National team to compete against New Zealand in 2005 and Matt in the 2004 Honour Team.

Support for the Junior Awards (Waratah, Banksia and Wattle) continues to increase, with 38 awards being made at the Annual Presentation Dinner. There has been a huge increase in the amount of Waratah awards with 18 children gaining over 200 points.

Thank you to Dave Lotty and the coaches for their continued support in training the Junior Squad and to the parents of all juniors for their efforts in getting young orienteers to events. It was very pleasing to see so many of our 'old' juniors taking on mentoring roles both at events and at training camps.

#### Belanglo

The Association continues to lease the house at Belanglo Forest from Forests NSW. The lease is contingent upon our maintaining the house and Chris Murphy as Hut Manager has ensured that this is done. The re-painting of the house commenced in 2004 and will be completed in early 2005.

The Siberian Husky Club and a number of Caravan/Mobile Home Clubs used the house during the year and together with regular orienteering use the costs of the house are comfortably covered. Forestry workers have also used the house as accommodation during the summer months.

#### **MTBO**

A program of 8 events was conducted during the year, primarily organised by MD with some assistance from BF and NC. The events attracted a good entry with a large percentage of these not being footO competitors.

The World MTBO Championships in Ballarat in October will no doubt contribute to the development of the discipline and it was pleasing that NSW had 2 representatives in the very successful Australian Team.
