## **REGISTRATION**

ONSW Manual 3.3

- 1 All members of clubs affiliated with ONSW must register with ONSW and pay the requisite fee.
- 2 Registration is possible as a Full member (Family, Senior or Junior) or as an Associate.
- 3 A Junior must be 20 years of age or younger in the year of registration.
- A Family consists of up to 2 Seniors domiciled at the same address and any number of Juniors who look to at least one of the Seniors as a parent.
- An Associate registration will receive the ONSW E-Bulletin but not the 'Australian Orienteer' and shall not be entitled to entry in the NSW Long Championships, membership of NSW Squads or Teams or participation in Orienteer of the Year point scores. Associate registrations shall not be included when counting club membership for club representation to ONSW.
- Registration can be carried out for each new or renewing registration unit (Family, Senior, Junior or Associate) by completing a membership form and forwarding it to ONSW by post or email with the required fees or, preferably, by registering on-line at the ONSW website using the Eventor system and paying the required fees electronically.
- Associated Group registration direct with ONSW is possible for school, scout or other community groups. Such groups shall receive the ONSW E-Bulletin. Restrictions on members of Associated Groups shall be as set out in ONSW Manual Section 3.5.
- 8 Special registration rates are available for new members (never before members of ONSW). A reduced rate for that year is available after 1 July. After 1 October the full current year fee is paid and the registration continues to the end of the following year.
- 9 For applicable registration fees, reference should be made to ONSW Manual Section 2.1.
