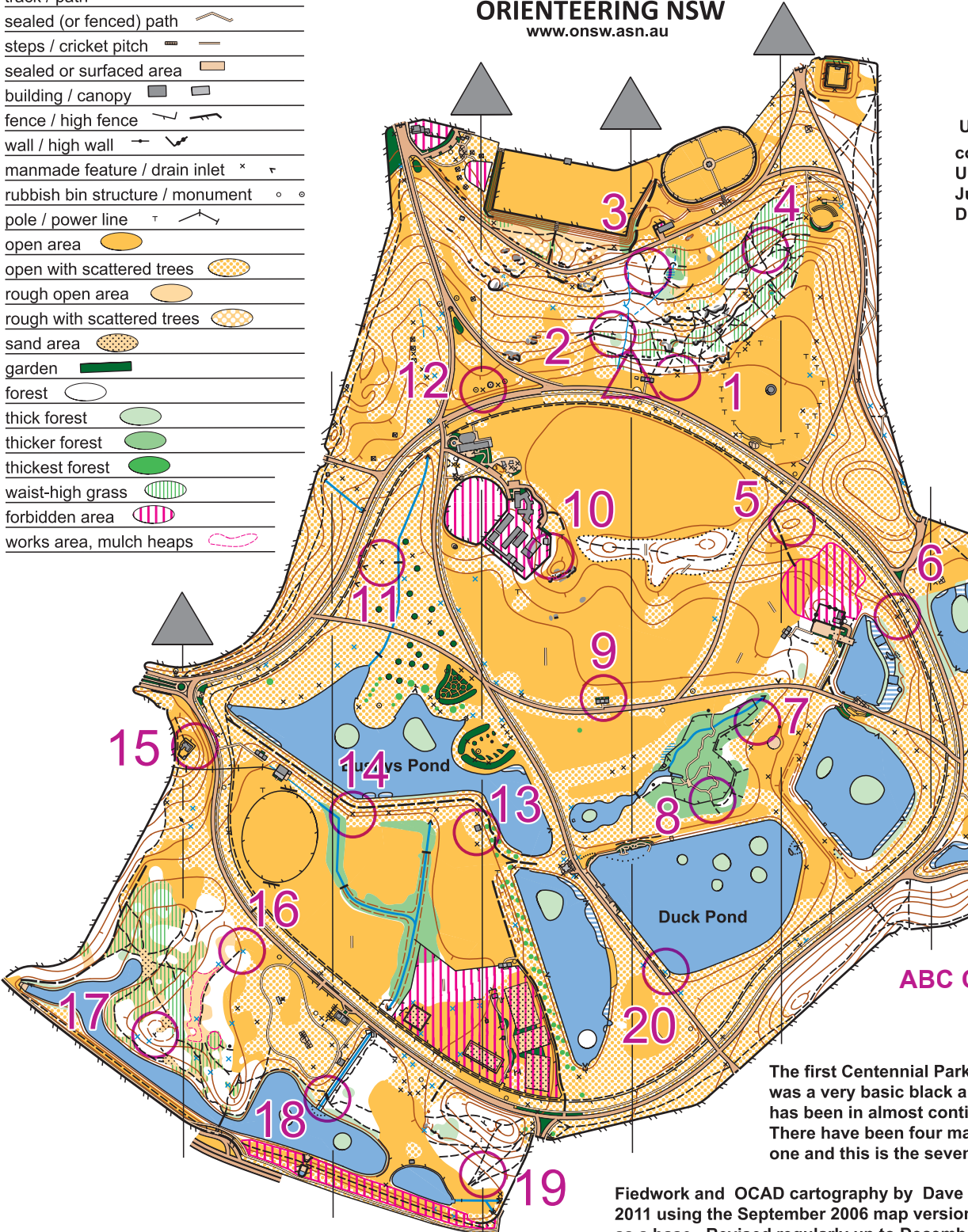
orienteeing map of Centennial Park
