The long distance event on Sunday attracted over 80 entries and the courses were a lot more challenging with some tricky navigation and route choices sorting out the places in each class. Many of the shortest routes were once again overgrown with the entry to the tracks being hard to find. There were quite a few water holes to cross which cooled things down for the riders.

Our competitor's had a great result with four age category winners and solid results in all classes. Both days were combined to produce the overall winners which included.
